I. "Personal Admonition: Purity"

Texts: I Tim 6:11-16,20,21; II Tim 1:1-8, 13-14; Titus 2:11-14; 3:1-8

I Tim 6:11-16, 20-21 - Paul's words to Timothy was (1) What to do, and (2) For whom to do it (6:11–14, 17–21).

- A. What is Timothy to do?
 - 1. Flee from evil, and follow after good (6:11).
 - 2. Fight the good fight of faith (6:12).
 - 3. Faithfully fulfill your ministry (6:13–14, 20a).
 - 4. Reject godless chatter and opposing ideas (6:20b-21).
- B. For whom is Timothy to do it? (6:15–16):
 - 1. The blessed and only Ruler (6:15a)
 - 2. The King of Kings (6:15b)
 - 3. The Lord of Lords (6:15c)
 - 4. The immortal and invisible God (6:16a)
 - 5. The One dwelling in unapproachable light (6:16b)

II Tim 1:1-8, 13-14 - Paul regards Timothy as his spiritual son.

- A. He tells Timothy that he is praying for him night and day. (1:1-3):
- B. He is aware of Timothy's tears (1:4) and his testimony (1:5).
- C. Paul urges Timothy to:
 - 1. Stir up his gift (1:6).
 - 2. Be fearless, strong, and loving (1:7).
 - 3. Be unashamed of Jesus or of Paul (1:8a).
 - 4. Be ready to suffer for Jesus (1:8b).
 - 5. Guard the great body of scriptural truth that has been given him (1:13-14).

Titus 2:11-14 - Paul told everyone in the church (1) what God has done for them (2:11,14); and (2) what they should do for God (2:12-13).

Titus 3:1-8 - In regard to rulers, we are to be obedient (3:1). In regard to everyone else, we are to be gentle (3:2). We find the work of God for our godlessness and His graciousness in verses 3–7.

II. "Personal Admonition: Development"

Texts: I Tim 4:6-16; II Tim 2:1-12; 3:14-17

I Tim 4:6-16 - Paul lists some dos and don'ts concerning Christian ministry (4:6–16).

- A. **The don'ts** (4:7a, 12a, 14)
 - 1. Don't waste time arguing over foolish ideas and silly myths (4:7a).
 - 2. Don't be intimidated because of your youth (4:12a).
 - 3. Don't neglect your spiritual gift (4:14).

B. The do's (4:6, 7b–11, 12b–13, 15–16)

- 1. Warn the church members concerning apostasy (4:6).
- 2. Keep spiritually fit (4:7b–11).
- 3. Be a godly role model in all you do (4:12b).
- 4. Continue to publicly read, teach, and preach the Word of God (4:13).
- 5. Give yourself wholly to the ministry (4:15).
- 6. Keep close check on your own life (4:16).

II Tim 2:1-12 - Paul likens the ministry to four secular occupations.

- A. Teacher (2:1-2)
- B. Soldier (2:3-4)
- C. Athlete (2:5)
- D. Farmer (2:6-7)

While a prisoner in Rome, Paul asks Timothy to remember that God's messenger is chained, but God's message cannot be chained (2:8–10).

The Results:

- A. If we die for Christ, we will live with Christ. (2:11)
- B. If we endure hardship for Christ, we will reign with Christ. (2:12a)
- C. If we deny Christ, he will deny us. (2:12b)
- D. If we are unfaithful, Christ remains faithful. (2:13)

2 Timothy 3:14-17 - Paul reminds Timothy (1) what the Scriptures did for him as a lad, and (2) what the Scriptures will do for him as the leader. The goal was to equip Timothy for every good work.

III. "Dealing with Sinful Men in the Church"

Texts: I Tim 5:17-25; 6:3-5; II Tim 1:15; 2:16-21; 2:23-26; 4:14-22; Titus 3:9-11

I Tim 5:17-25 - Elders:

- 1. Are worthy of double honor. (5:17-18)
- 2. Must never be unjustly accused. (5:19-20, 24-25)
- 3. Must be impartial. (5:21)
- 4. Must be proven before being ordained. (5:22a)
- 5. Must keep themselves pure. (5:22b)

1 Tim 6:3-5 - The wicked:

- 1. Deny the faith (6:3-4a)
- 2. Are conceited and argumentative. (6:4b)
- 3. Cause confusion, envy, and friction. (6:4c)
- 4. Use spiritual things for financial gain. (6:5)

II Tim 1:15-18: The apostle's companions:

- 1. His deserting friends (1:15): Most of Paul's coworkers in Asia have abandoned him.
- 2. His devoted friend (1:16–18): Onesiphorus has remained a faithful and helpful friend.

II Tim 2:14-26 - Paul tells Timothy to:

- A. Remind your people of the great scriptural truths (2:14a).
- B. Warn them against petty arguments (2:14b).
- C. Strive to become an approved workman before God (2:15).
- D. Avoid godless controversies (2:16–19).
 - 1 The error of Hymenaeus and Philetus (2:16–19).
- E. Present your body as a clean vessel to God (2:20–21).
- F. Avoid evil, and pursue good (2:22).
- G. Don't have anything to do with foolish and stupid arguments, because they produce quarrels. (2:23)
- H. Gently instruct those who oppose him with the goal of leading them to repentance. (2:23-26)

II Tim 4:14-22 – Paul's friends have forsaken him (4:16).

Paul's Final Song of Praise (4:17–18)

- A. God has delivered him from the mouth of the lion (4:17–18a).
- B. God will deliver him to the Kingdom of Heaven (4:18b).

Paul sends his final greetings (4:19–22).

Titus 3:8-11 - THE WARNING FROM GOD

- A. Concerning controversial issues (3:8–9): Titus must not involve himself in arguing over foolish and unanswerable questions.
- B. Concerning controversial individuals (3:10–11)
 - 1. They are to be warned twice (3:10a).
 - 2. They are, if unrepentant, to be "excommunicated" (disfellowshipped) (3:10b–11).
